

School Board Meeting Highlights

Mar. 12, 2024 - The School Board of Orange County held its regularly-scheduled board meeting at 5 p.m. at the Ronald Blocker Educational Leadership Center. These are the highlights of the meeting:

School Board holds first public hearing on the adoption of K-12 Science Textbooks

The committees for K-12 Science have made the selections to recommend the adoption of the titles listed under Primary Committee Selection. An alternate committee selection is also listed if the primary selection is not on the state's final list. In addition, a committee was convened to select instructional materials for the new high school required Financial Literacy and Money Management course for one year. Another adoption will occur in 2024-2025 to choose a 3-year option in alignment with the revised FLDOE instructional materials adoption timeline. The next public meeting April 2, 2024 the public may provide comments prior to the School Board's approval of the instructional materials plan identifying the instructional materials that will be purchased.
